
training through a physiology and biophysics fellowship at the University of Mississippi Medical Center.

Distinction in Aging Pathway Approved for Medical Students

Medical students with an interest in learning more about how to better care for older adults, regardless of their future specialty, can now set themselves apart by earning a Distinction in Aging, making UT Southwestern one of the few medical schools in the nation to offer such a pathway.

"The Distinction in Aging is designed to help medical students develop an expertise in caring for older adults and promote scholarly work within the field of aging," says **Debbie Freeland, M.D.**, a co-director of the four-year pathway with **Jessica Voit, M.D.**, both Assistant Professors in the Division of Geriatric Medicine.

The pathway includes 24 weeks of experiences in aging, including pre-clerkship, clinical, community, and scholarly experiences. Those pursuing a Distinction in Aging will need to complete their Scholarly Activity in Aging and write a thesis on an aging topic in their final year.

"This concentration has broad applications across clinical care, research skills, and policy/advocacy work that goes beyond a Distinction in Aging," Dr. Freeland says. "We're hoping this pathway will spark passion among students interested in gaining expertise in aging and will position UT Southwestern as a leading institution that supports medical students in gaining the knowledge, skills, and frameworks for addressing the unique healthcare needs of older adults."


All faculty, staff, house staff, and students working or training within our University Hospital and clinics or at any UTSW or affiliated clinical research sites or locations <u>are required</u> to

If you would like to receive your flu and COVID-19 vaccinations simultaneously, you may schedule both through MyChart.

Since the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services withdrew its COVID-19 mandate for healthcare workers, COVID-19 vaccination is now optional for members of our Health System.
