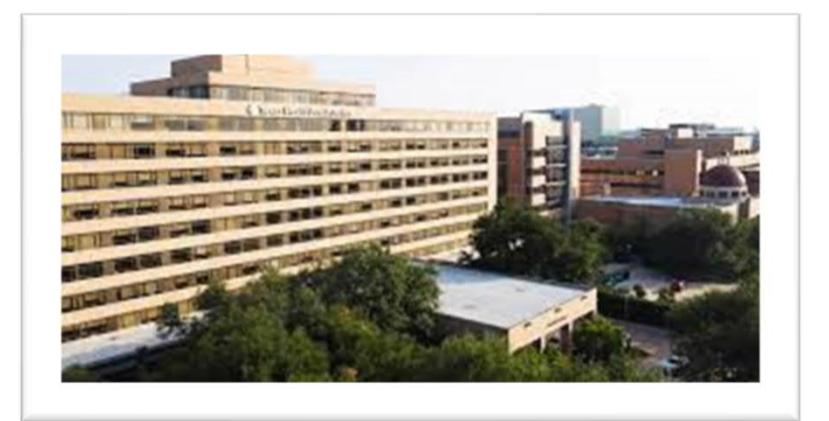

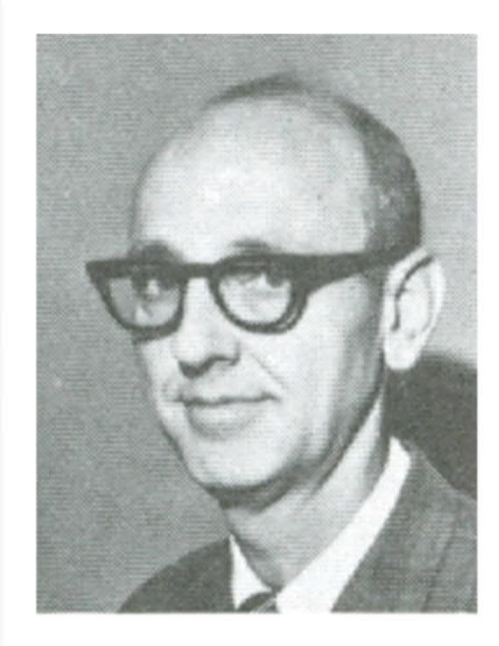

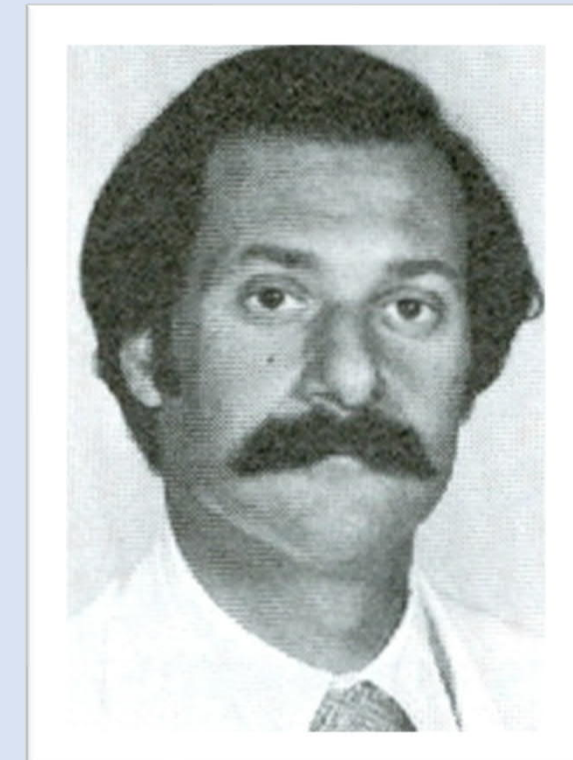

1973: Dr. Charles Rosenfeld named Division Chief



1974: Dr. Rosenfeld opens the first NICU in North Texas at Parkland Hospital

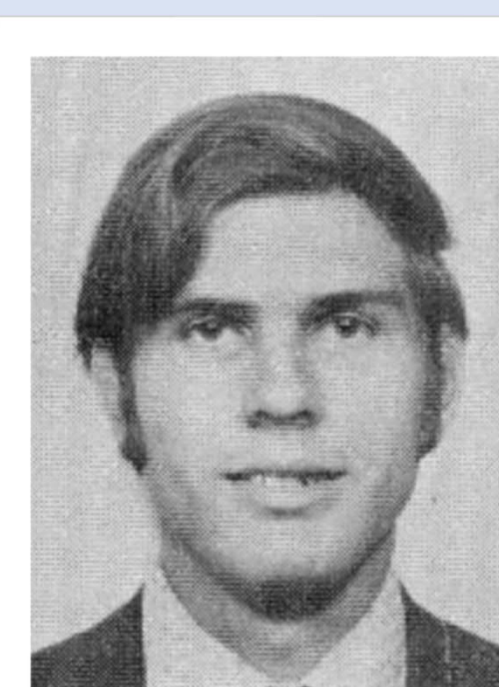


1975: Dr. Rosenfeld establishes the Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship Program

1975: Davis quintuplets, born at Parkland Hospital, one of the first sets of surviving quintuplets in North America



1976: Drs. Charles Rosenfeld and Jon Tyson start the Neonatal Database



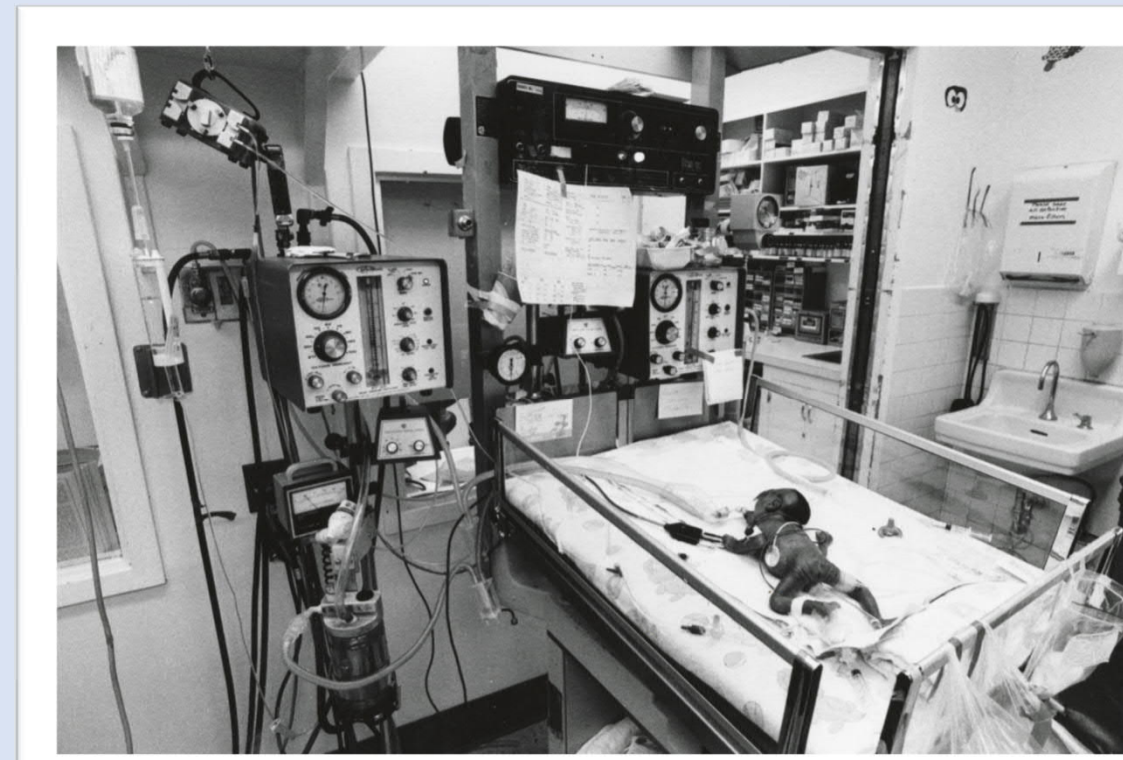
1979: The Low Birthweight Clinic/THRIVE Program opens at Children's Medical Center, staffed by Dr. Roy Heyne

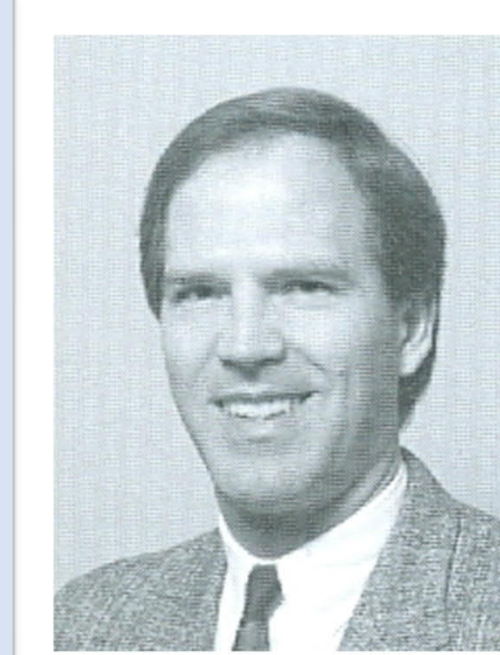


1981: Dr. Jon Tyson starts neonatal outreach program

1984: Parkland Hospital opens a new NICU with 60 beds

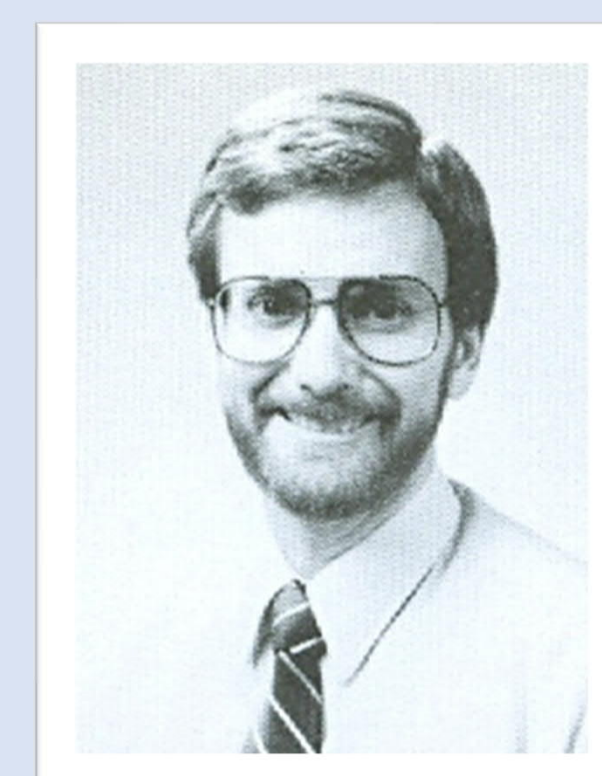


1986: Division selected as a founding site for the NIH-Neonatal Research Network and has been a continuous site to this day



1986: Dr. Philip Shaul joins division and starts ground-breathing research in nitric oxide caveolae regulation

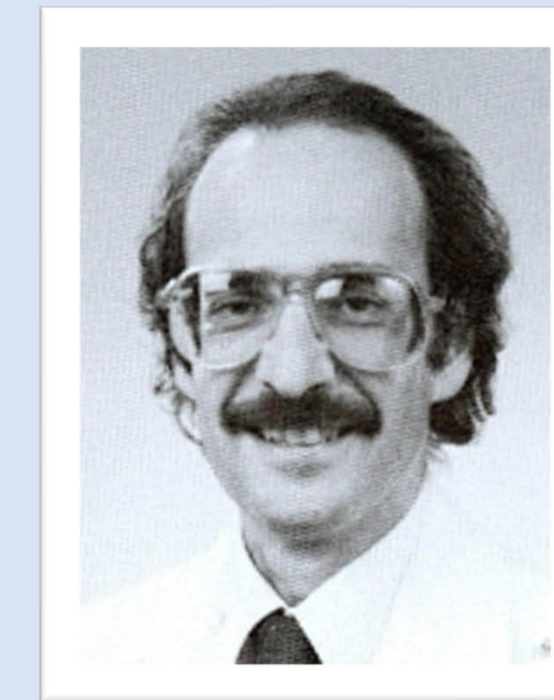
1989: Dr. Greg Jackson develops Pediatric Nurse Practitioner Program

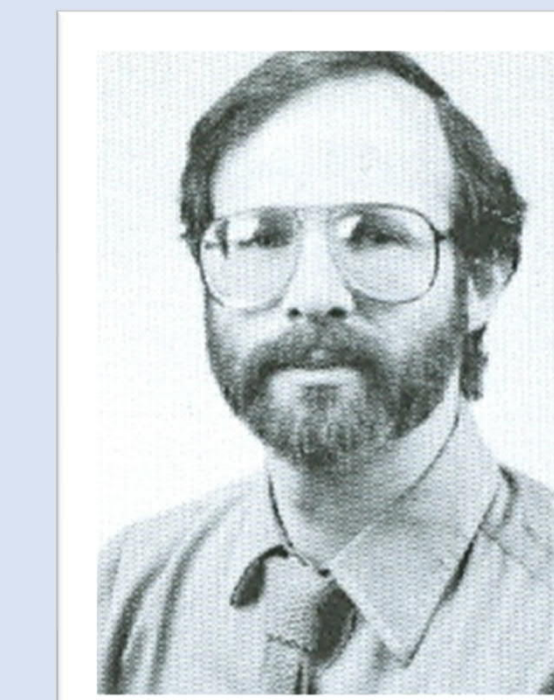
1990s: Parkland NICU designated as a Center of Excellence

1990s: Dr. Jeff Perlman starts the Resuscitation Database

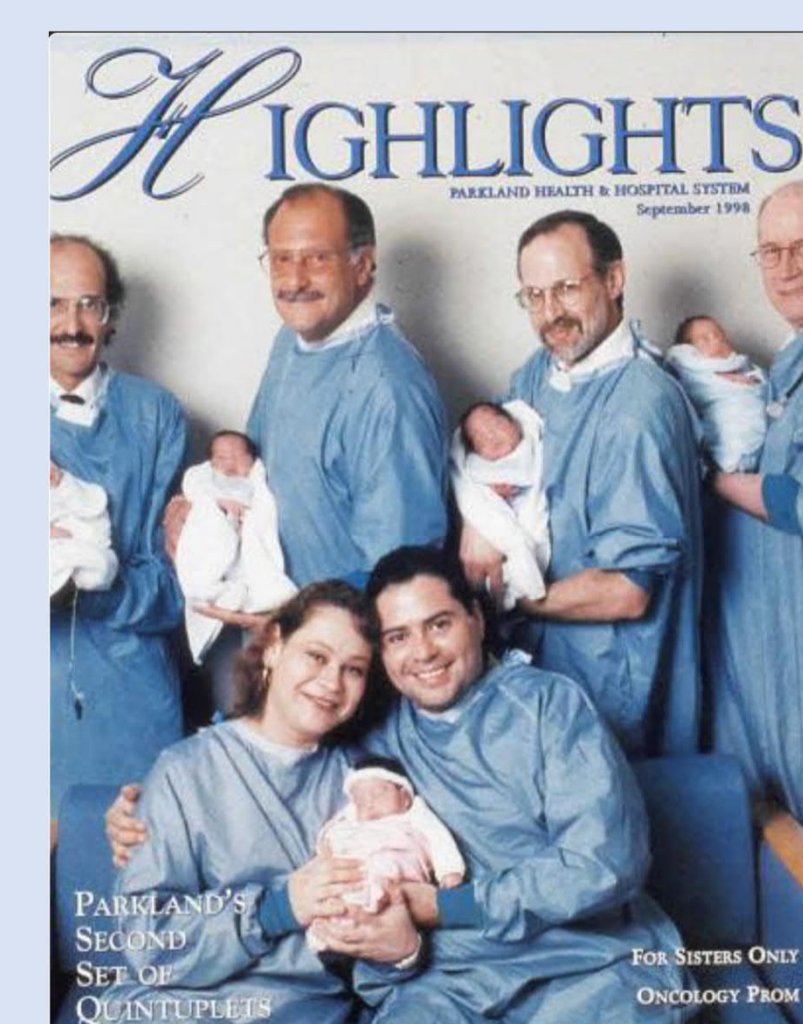

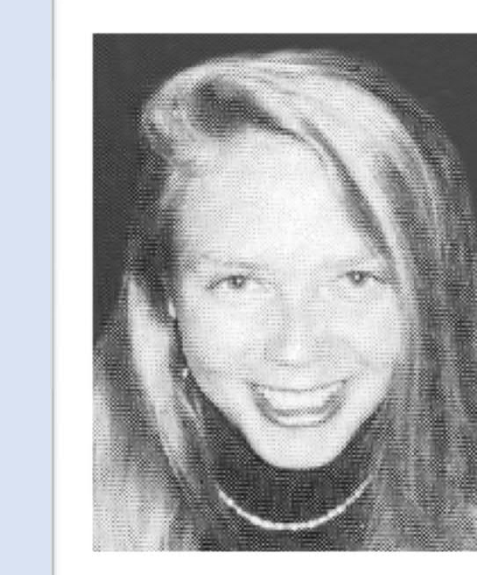
1994: High Frequency Oscillatory Ventilation introduced into the NICU by Dr. Fernando Moya



1998: The Zuniga quintuplets are born at Parkland Hospital



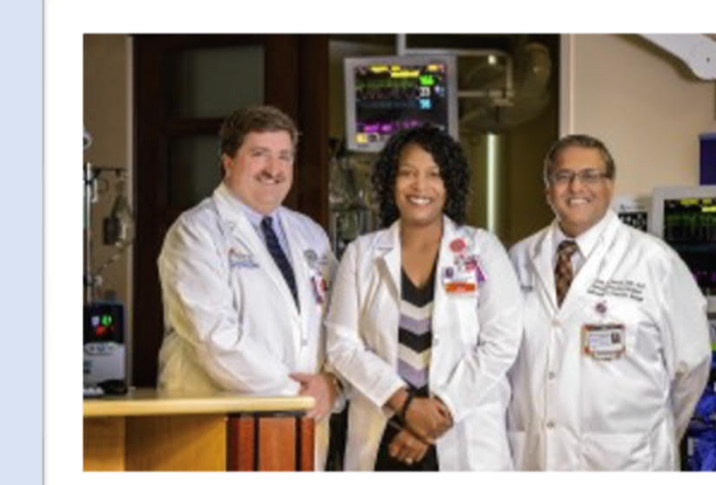

2000: Dr. Myra Wyckoff becomes Director of Newborn Resuscitation Services and advances the field of neonatal resuscitation

2001: Parkland Hospital sets national record of delivering 16,597 babies in 1 year

2003: Dr. Roy Heyne named Medical Director of THRIVE Program

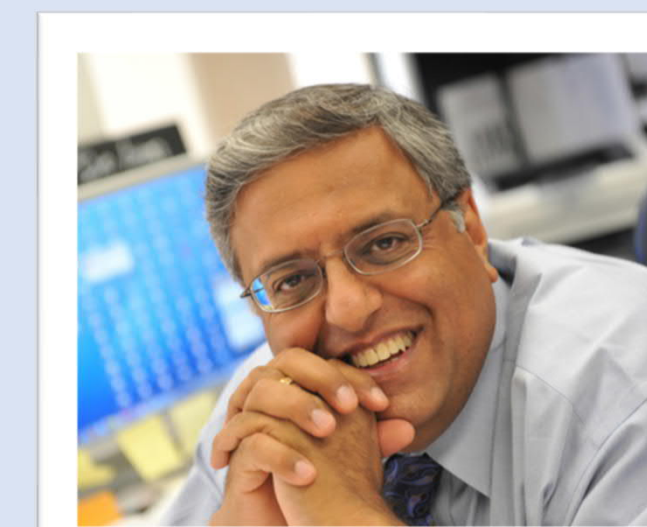


2007: Children's Medical Center NICU is launched

2013: Division starts its 3rd NICU at St. Paul University Hospital

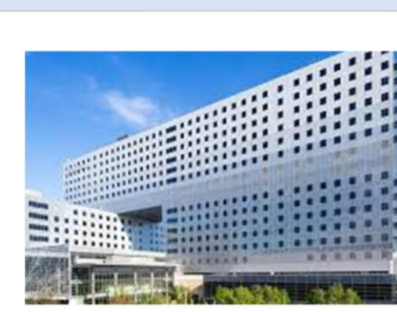


2013: TeleNICU program established, a first for the region

2014: St. Paul NICU moves to new Clements University Hospital

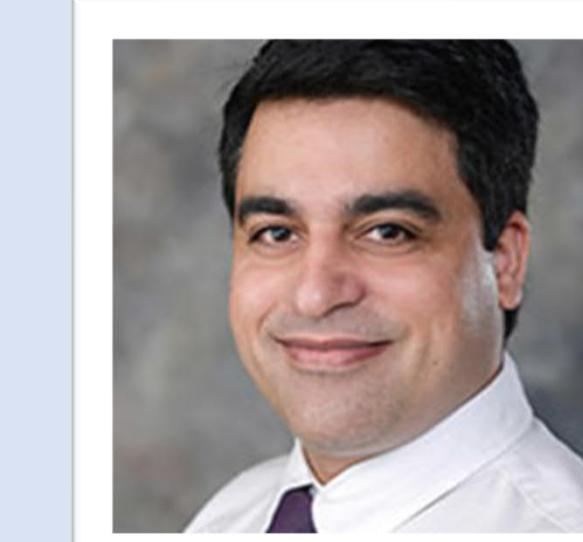


2015: Parkland NICU moves to new Hospital



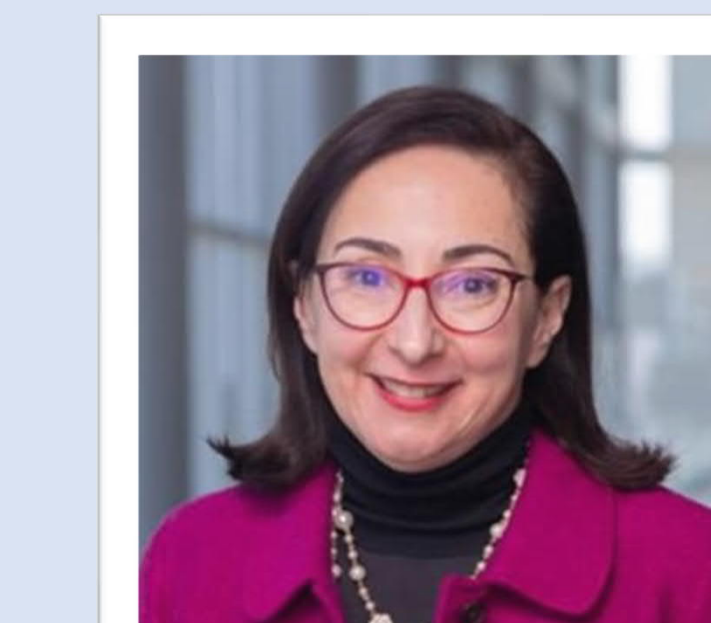
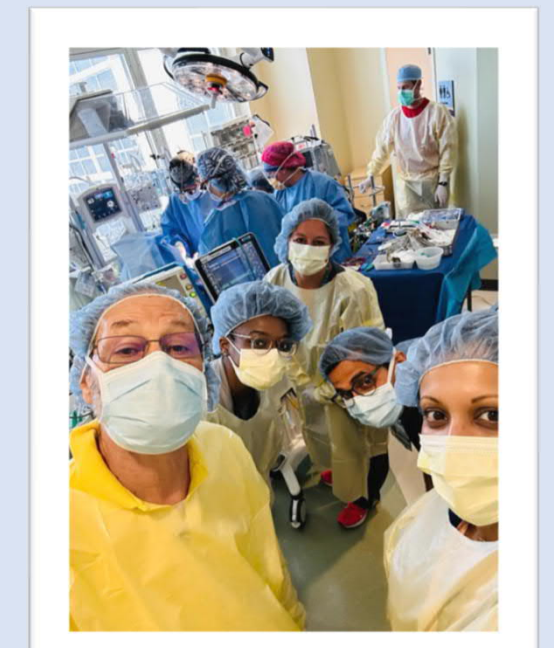
2015: Division assumes NICU care at Texas Health Presbyterian Dallas

2023: ECMO established in NICU at Children's Medical Center



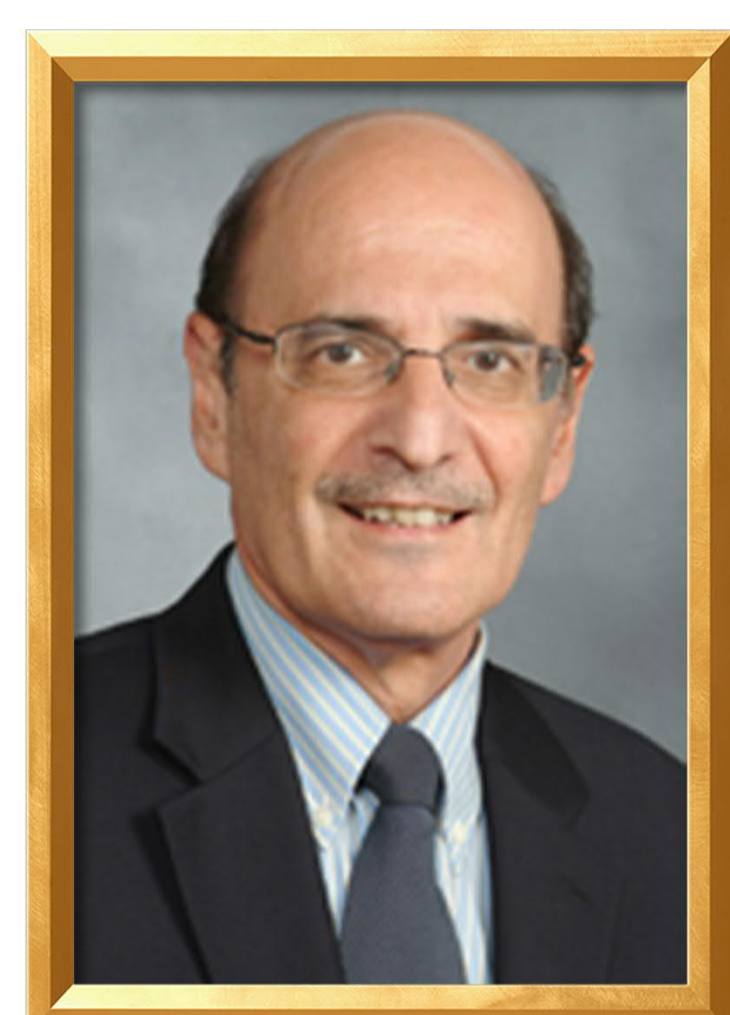

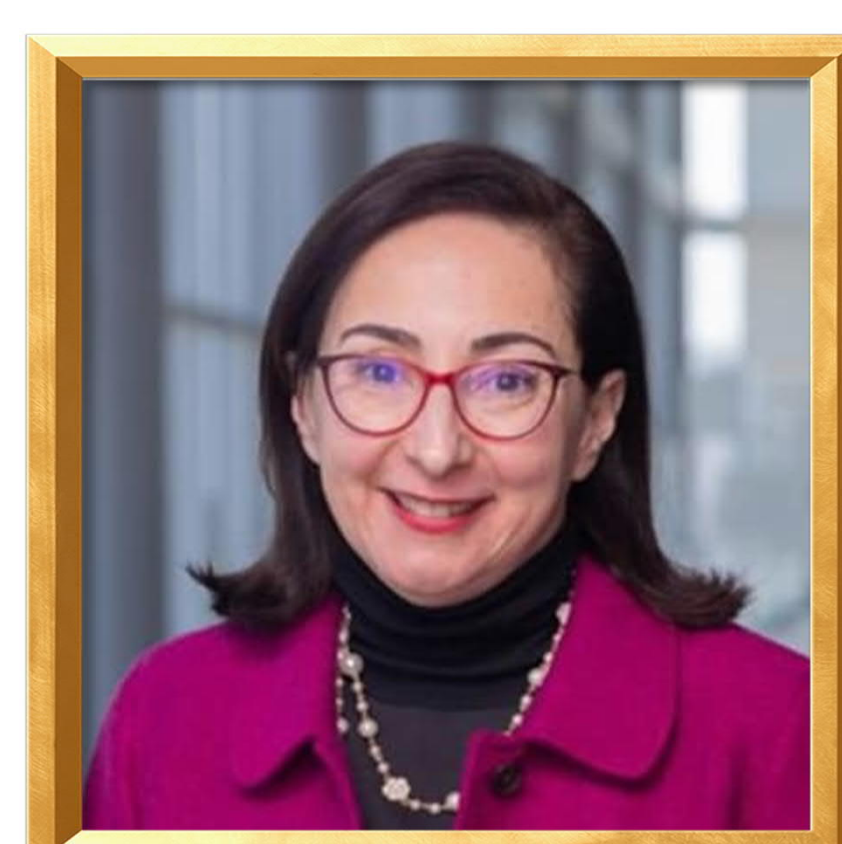

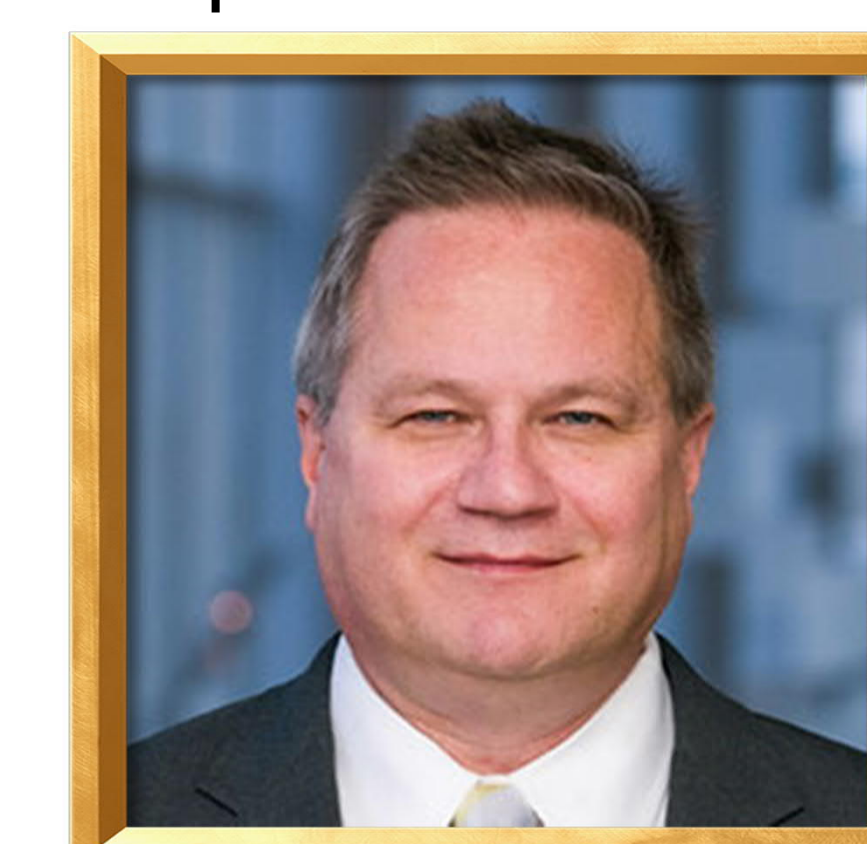
