Education and Training

Medical Students

Two of our division faculty serve as deans of the medical school, and three serve as mentors to medical students through the UT Southwestern Colleges Program. One faculty member is an Assistant Director for the Colleges Program.

Residents

Division faculty provide clinical training to pediatric and combined internal medicine and pediatrics (Med-Peds) residents at the Children's Health Medical Group (CHMG) Medical District pediatric primary care practice, which serves as a continuity clinic site to over 20 residents, as well as an ambulatory care training site for pediatric interns. A division faculty member directs the Community Pediatrics and Advocacy rotation, which is required for all pediatrics and Med-Peds interns. Division faculty also mentor residents and students on scholarly projects.
