



This morning, UT Southwestern and Children's Health announced plans to build a

33-acre pediatric campus across from William P. Clements Jr. University Hospital off Harry Hines Boulevard. The project, which follows years of careful consideration and community input, will position our two institutions to deliver innovative clinical care and transformative science well into the future, and is intended to meet our region's need for pediatric care. Dallas-Fort Worth's pediatric population of nearly 2.5 million is expected to double by 2050. The new pediatric campus, upon completion, will replace the existing Children's Medical Center Dallas. It will feature two 12-story towers and an eight-story tower

that will significantly expand inpatient, surgical, and ambulatory capacity. Highlights include 552 inpatient beds (a 38% increase), 96 additional outpatient exam rooms, and 15% more Emergency Department space, among many other enhancements. We anticipate breaking ground on the campus later this year. 





