

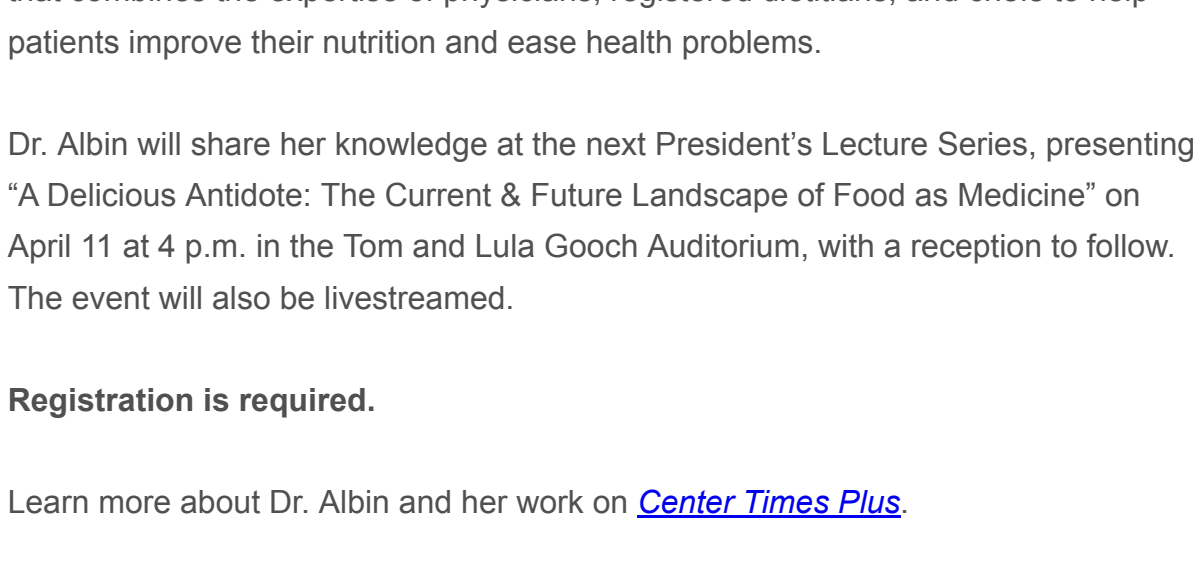
## UTSW joins national AI consortium

Artificial intelligence holds the potential to transform the health care industry by accelerating research, enhancing efficiency, and improving outcomes.

To help develop standards to guide the safe application of AI throughout the field, UT Southwestern has joined other leading medical centers across the country to form the Trustworthy & Responsible AI Network (TRAIN). The group will collaborate to advance quality and trust in AI practices through a variety of steps, including sharing best practices, providing tools to enable the measurement of outcomes, and facilitating the development of a national AI outcomes registry.

"Advancing AI in health care will be well served through a collective initiative such as this one that will allow us to responsibly harness AI potential for the betterment of patient care and outcomes," said **Eric Peterson, M.D., M.P.H.**, Professor of Internal Medicine, Vice Provost and Senior Associate Dean for Clinical Research. "We look forward to our role in guiding medicine into an exciting new era of discovery."

## President's Lecture to serve up 'Food as Medicine'

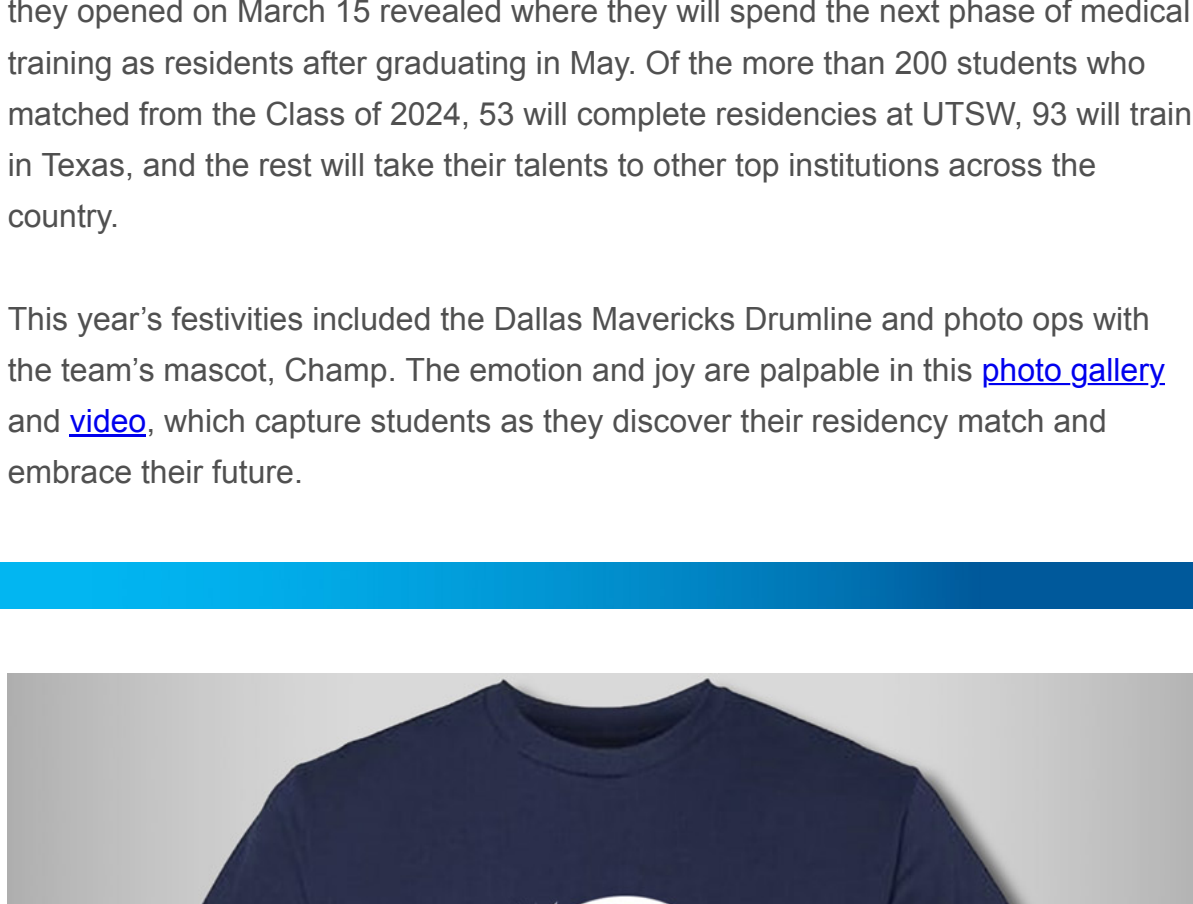

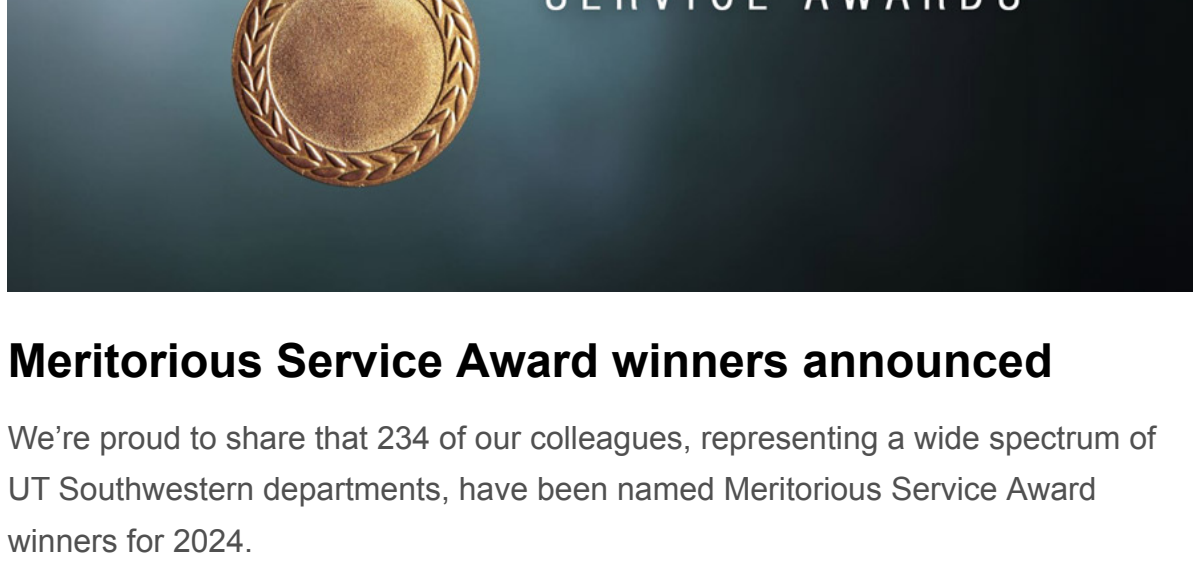
## Limited-edition eclipse T-shirts: How to get yours

## Meritorious Service Award winners announced

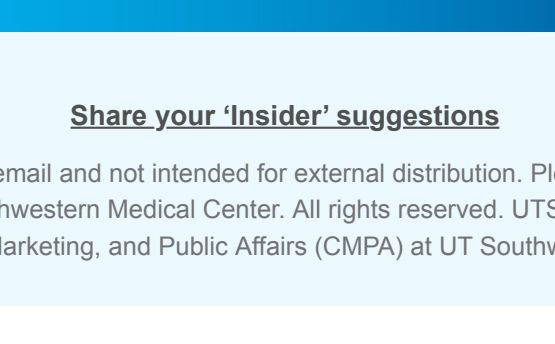
We're proud to share that 234 of our colleagues, representing a wide spectrum of UT Southwestern departments, have been named Meritorious Service Award winners for 2024.

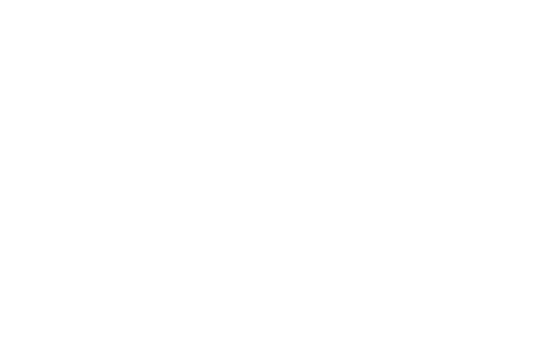
### Women's History Month Celebration
