



## Pogue family gives \$100 million to new pediatric campus

Leaders from UT Southwestern and Children's Health gathered last Wednesday to announce a historic \$100 million gift from the Jean and Mack Pogue family in support of the new \$5 billion pediatric campus to be built across from William P. Clements Jr. University Hospital. In recognition, the 33-acre site for the pediatric campus will be named Pogue Park.

"Through their remarkable foresight and philanthropy, Mack and Jean Pogue have advanced groundbreaking research at UT Southwestern, with a special focus on children," said UT Southwestern President **Daniel K. Podolsky, M.D.** "The discoveries they have helped make possible will come to life through the multidisciplinary, cutting-edge care that children from North Texas and beyond will receive at our new pediatric campus."

The gift from the Pogue Foundation is the largest donation yet to the pediatric campus project, which will replace the existing Children's Medical Center Dallas. Over the past four decades, the Pogue family has given more than \$200 million to Children's Health and UT Southwestern.

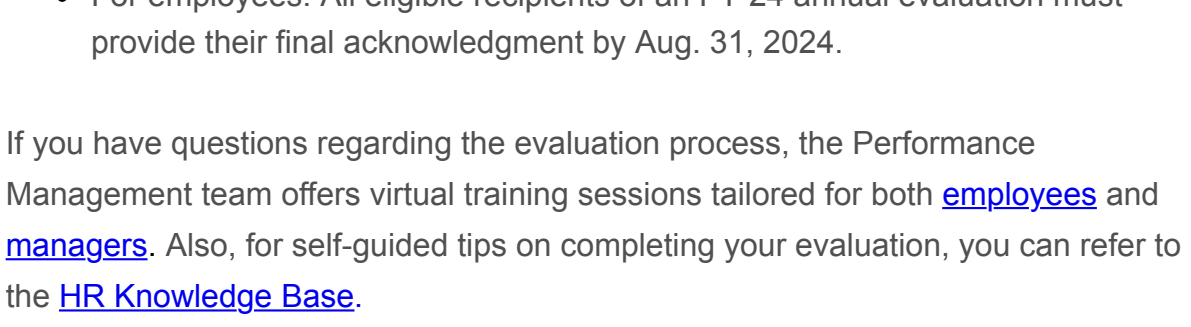

Whether you're a manager providing feedback or an individual reflecting on your progress, intentional engagement throughout this process will support personal, professional, and collective success for our UTSW team.

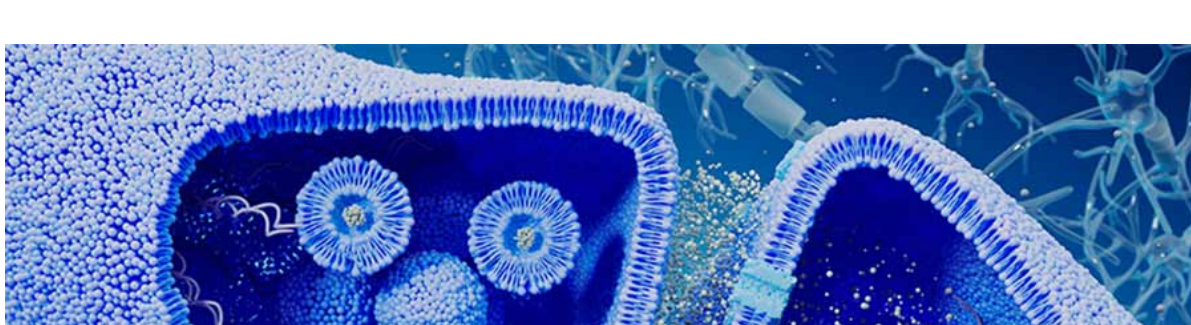
Important reminders:

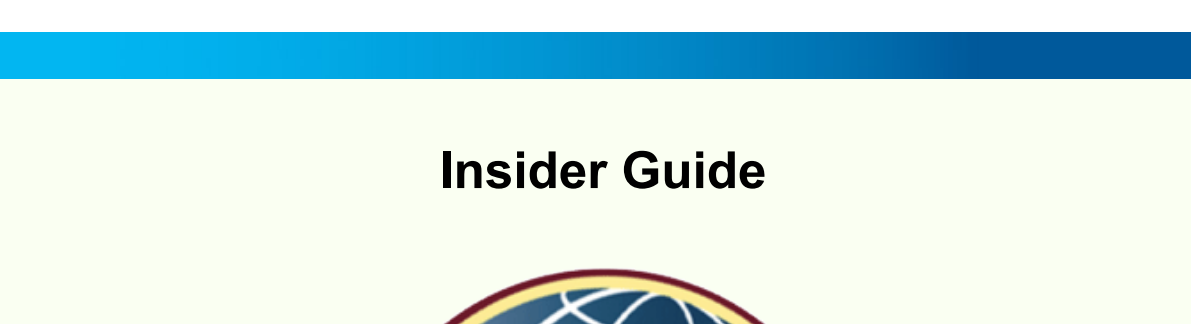

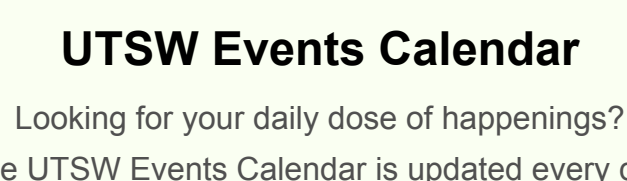
## Depression: From hope to help

The O'Donnell Brain Institute (OBI) is pioneering a comprehensive approach to combat treatment-resistant depression by assembling a large, multidisciplinary team to explore innovative treatments, from transcranial magnetic stimulation to biomarker development.

The OBI's ultimate goal is to develop individualized care for patients whose treatment has largely been one of trial and error. In a field where the cost of this process can be significant, their work is leading not only to an expanding range of therapeutic options but also to more effective algorithms that help match an individual's depression to a specific (and effective) therapy.
