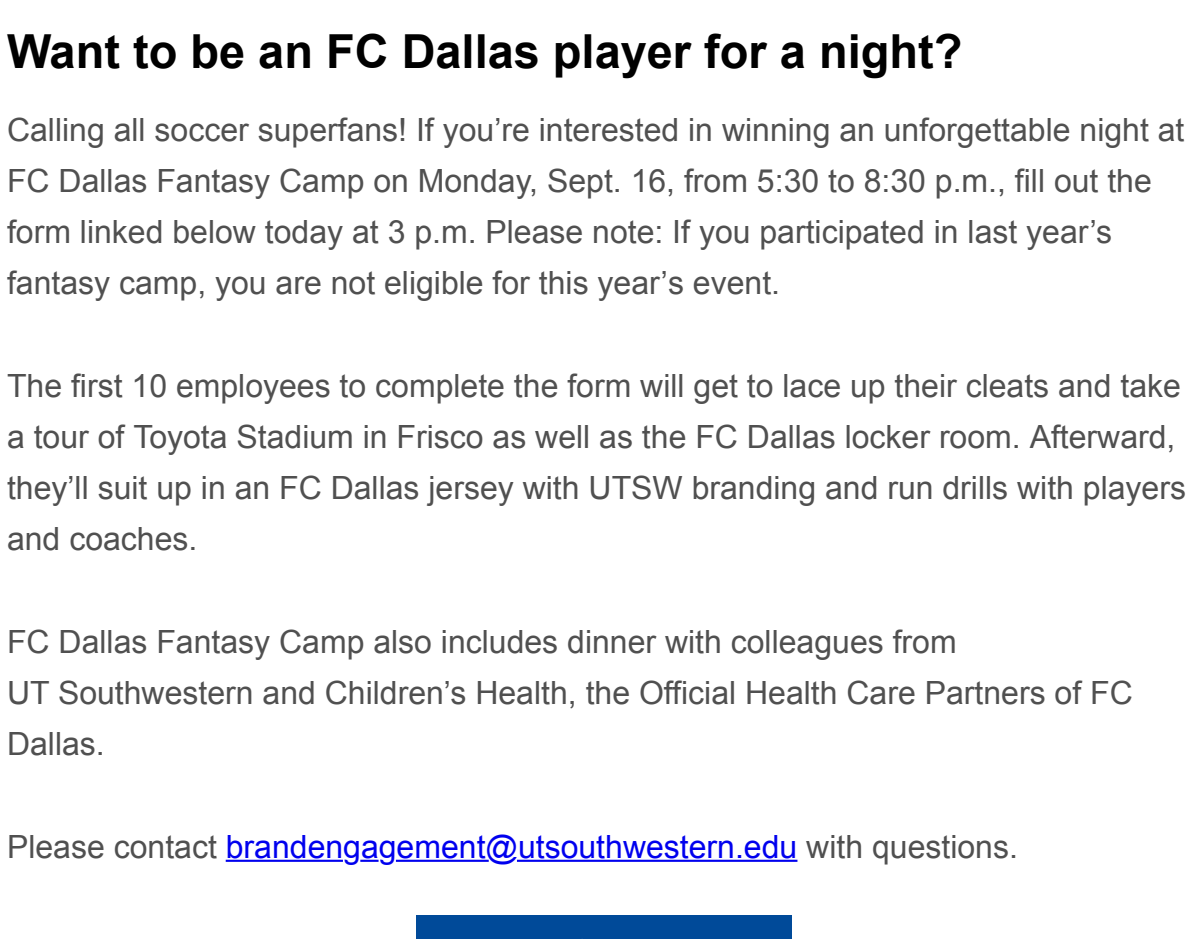


ServiceNow will require Duo for remote users

Information Resources (IR) has announced that, starting Sept. 12, off-campus access to ServiceNow will require two-factor authentication (Duo). This secondary control provides added data protection.

All ServiceNow users not on a UT Southwestern trusted network who access the platform will be required to authenticate with Duo. The process is currently undergoing user acceptance testing to help ensure a smooth launch. Two-factor authentication will gradually be added to other enterprise applications in the coming months.

Want to be an FC Dallas player for a night?

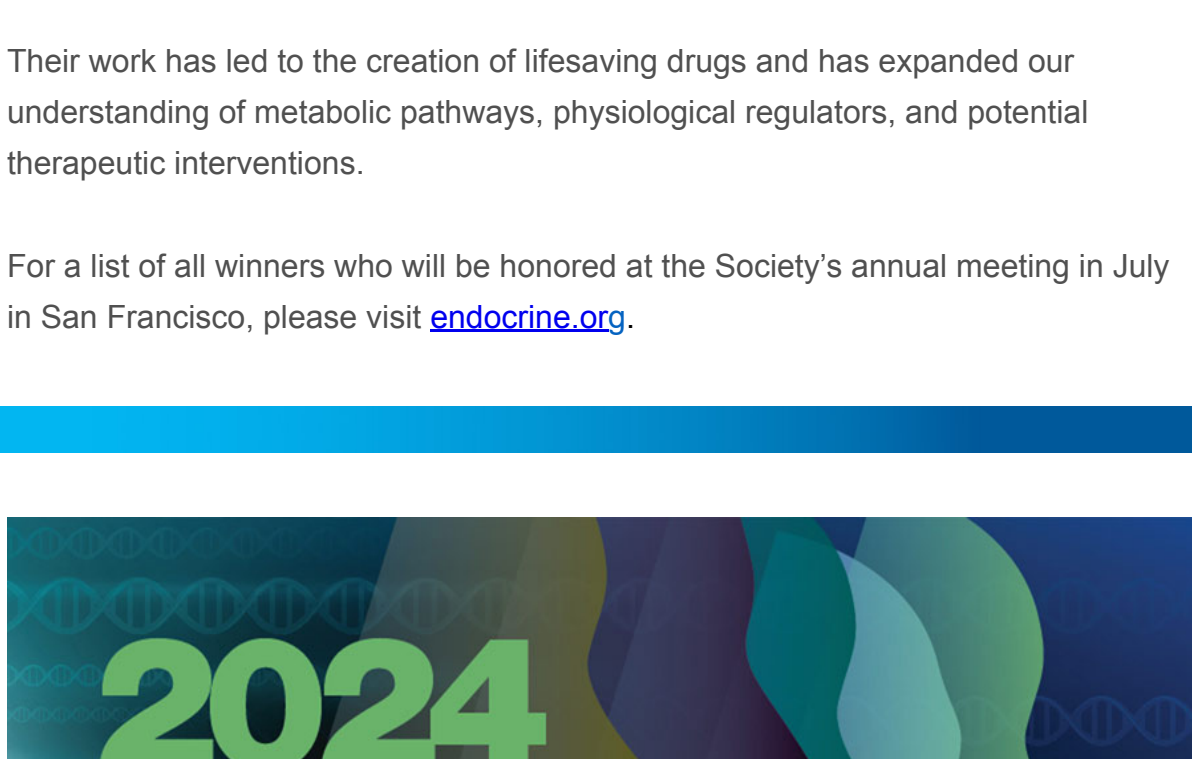

UTSW researchers earn Endocrine Society honor

Congratulations to UT Southwestern's **David Mangelsdorf, Ph.D.**, and **Steven Kliewer, Ph.D.**, who were named among the winners of the Endocrine Society's 2025 Laureate Awards – one of the top honors in the field. They earned the Edwin B. Astwood Award for Outstanding Research in Basic Science.

Dr. Mangelsdorf, Chair and Professor of Pharmacology, and Dr. Kliewer, Professor of Molecular Biology and Pharmacology, are both members of the National Academy of Sciences who run a [joint lab at UTSW](#) that has made groundbreaking discoveries in endocrine signaling through nuclear receptor research.

Their work has led to the creation of lifesaving drugs and has expanded our understanding of metabolic pathways, physiological regulators, and potential therapeutic interventions.

Connect with UT Southwestern's newest faculty

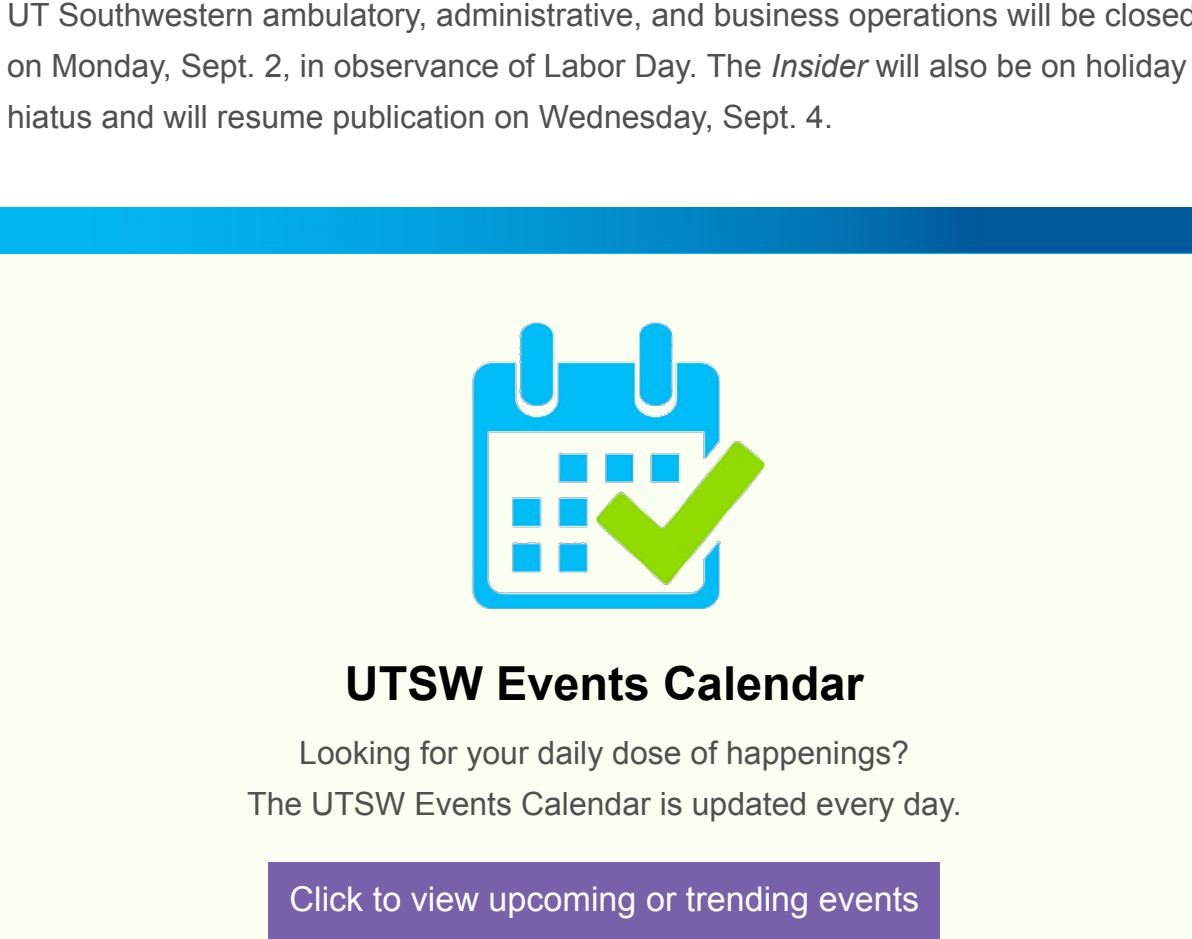
Hear from our recently appointed Assistant Professors who are shaping the future of research at UT Southwestern at the 2024 New Faculty Research Forum.
