

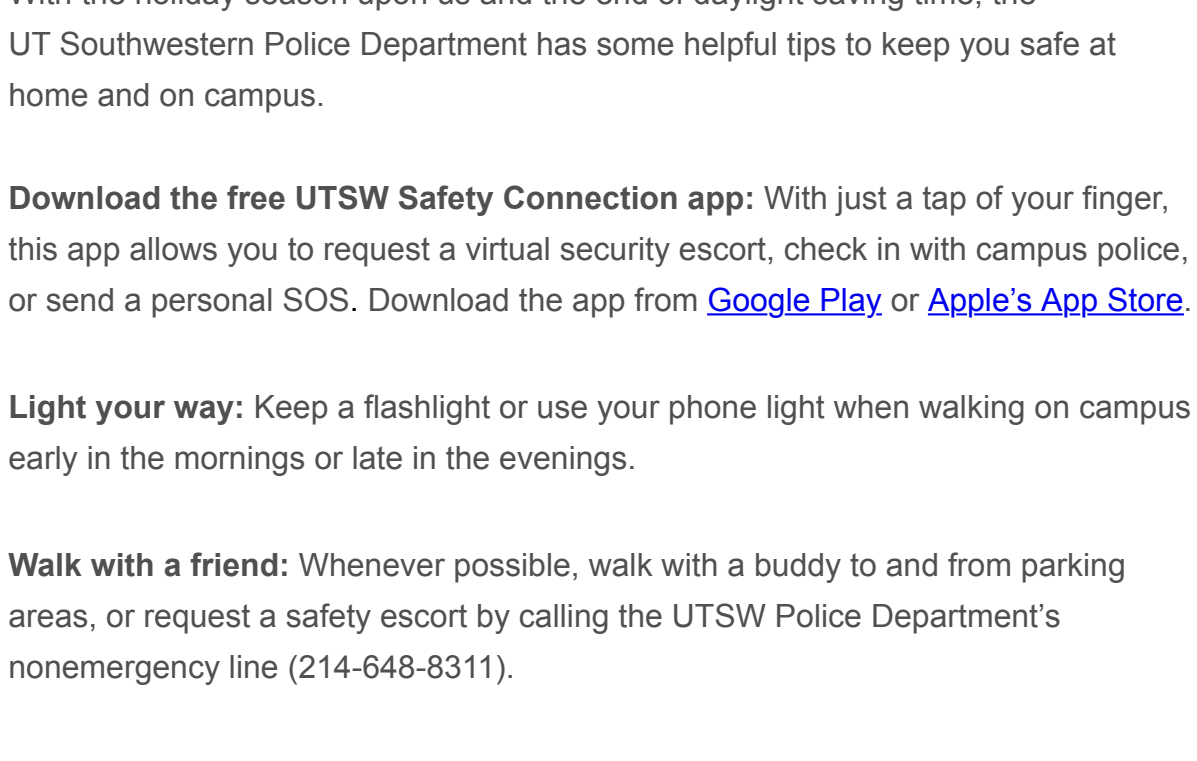


Support UTSW at Celebrity Cutting Horse Event

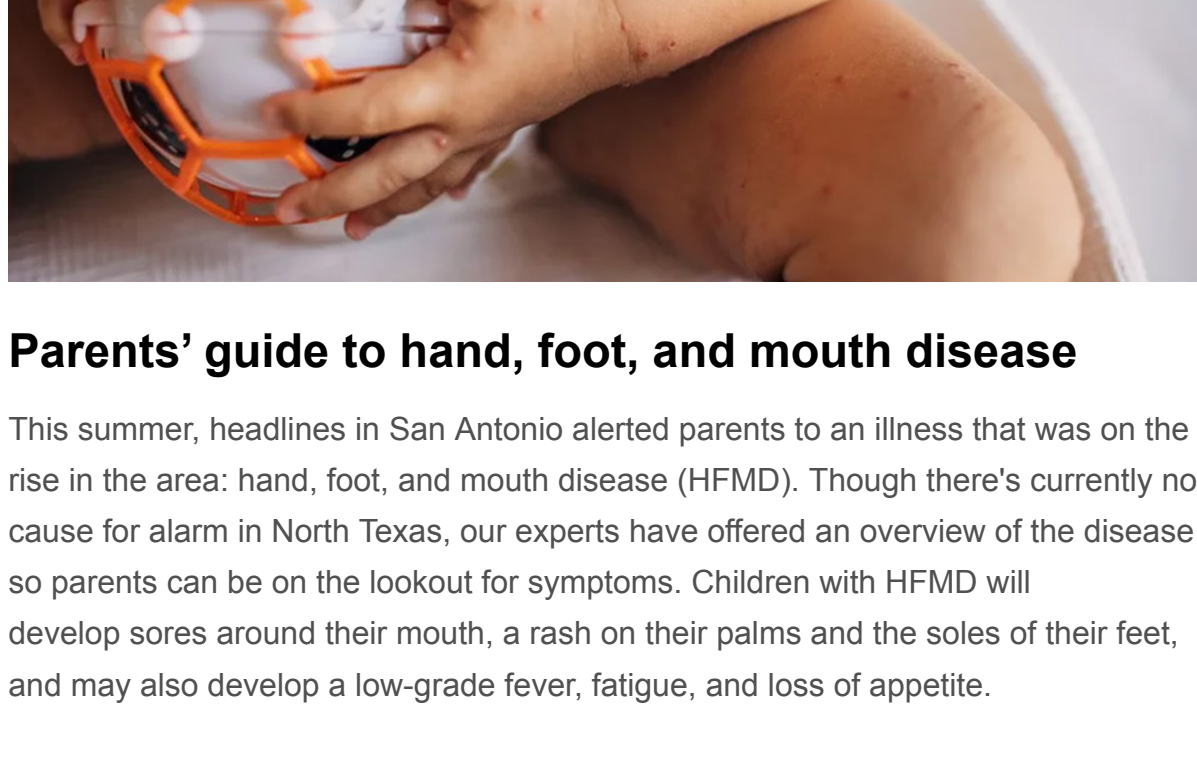
Light your way: Keep a flashlight or use your phone light when walking on campus early in the mornings or late in the evenings.

Parents' guide to hand, foot, and mouth disease

This summer, headlines in San Antonio alerted parents to an illness that was on the rise in the area: hand, foot, and mouth disease (HFMD). Though there's currently no cause for alarm in North Texas, our experts have offered an overview of the disease so parents can be on the lookout for symptoms. Children with HFMD will develop sores around their mouth, a rash on their palms and the soles of their feet, and may also develop a low-grade fever, fatigue, and loss of appetite.

If you suspect your child might have HFMD, [Clifford Chen, M.D.](#), a UT Southwestern pediatrician, suggests seeking medical attention. Most who contract HFMD recover with supportive care, but a child with the virus may need to be isolated for seven to 10 days. While cases generally occur in children younger than 5, elementary-aged kids can also contract the disease, and adults may catch it from their children.
