





Innovative procedure removes GI tumors with

In 2021, Jorge Gómez received a shock when a routine doctor's visit revealed a 4centimeter growth in his esophagus. It was a grim diagnosis that held an uncertain future, but the Cuban asylum-seeker-turned-engineer and father of four knew he could overcome the odds. He simply needed the right medical team to help him.

precision, not incisions

Fortunately, he found his answer at UT Southwestern, where Markus Goldschmiedt, M.D., and Thomas Tielleman, M.D., were building their reputation as experts of a rare and highly specialized procedure capable of treating certain GI cancers.

This minimally invasive technique, endoscopic submucosal dissection (ESD), allowed Dr. Goldschmiedt to successfully extract Mr. Gómez's tumor without
